Course Title: Node.js

Course Description: Node.js is an open-source, cross-platform JavaScript run-time environment for executing JavaScript code on a server. In this class you will learn where Node fits into the web application landscape, how to build applications in Node, and come away with a sample application demonstrating what you've learned. This class is a workshop style class, including lectures followed by workshop time, and code along with the instructor.
